

Dear Colleagues,

Please find hereafter an advertisement for a 3-year ECVD veterinary dermatology residency at VetAgro Sup, France.

This second dermatology residency position is intended to provide advanced clinical and research training in veterinary and comparative dermatology as a formalized program of the European Veterinary Dermatology (ECVD).

The program length is three years beginning on May 1, 2014. The position will be for 12 months in the first instance and is renewable on an annual basis for up to three years, subject to satisfactory review.

Gross remuneration vary from 1445 to 1590 €/month during the residency, for a 5-day working week, with 25-day annual leave.

Individuals applying for this residency must meet the qualifications required for candidates qualifying for board-certification by the European College of Veterinary Dermatology:

Resident applicants must be:

- veterinary graduates.
- have completed a minimum one year, recognized, general clinical training programme in an academic institution or satisfactory practice equivalent.

The successful applicant will study and training to sit the ECVD Diploma examination under the mentorship of Didier Pin, DrMedVet, PhD, DipECVD (Program Director and Resident Supervisor), Dorothee Watrelot, DrMedVet, DipECVP (resident advisor 1), Jean-Luc Cadoré, DrMedVet, Dip ECVIM-CA.

Good interpersonal and learning skills are essential. For international applicants, it is essential that the successful applicant has a registerable veterinary degree in France, as well as an appropriate work permit. Successful applicants need to speak French fluently as client and student interactions typically are in French.
