## **ESVD** Grant

ESVD wishes to encourage high standards in all aspects of veterinary dermatology and to promote the development of related research. Therefore, an annual research grant has been awarded since 1996 by the ESVD for basic or clinical research in veterinary dermatology. Each grant is to the value of 5,000 Euros.

Ordinarily projects are expected to be of one to two years' duration. Applicants are expected to propose a project of scientific merit that is applicable to veterinary dermatology. Grants are evaluated on scientific merit, feasibility, and usefulness. Preference will be given to novel proposals including the development of pilot studies. Applications for support of some identifiable component of an ongoing research work will also be considered. It is not the intention to provide funds for single items of capital expenditure. Please note that the Society is not in a position to support the costs of institutional overheads. Any use of experimental animals must conform to the local ethical and animal welfare regulations.

Proposals should be received by April 1 each year for consideration by the grant awarding committee. Research proposals (four copies) should be sent to the current ESVD Publications and Grant secretary (Dr. Chiara Noli, Strada Madonna 58, 12016 Peveragno (CN), Italy). An acknowledgement will be sent. All applications will be subject to peer review and must include background information, project aims and objectives, project design, specific methods, budget together with an explanation of the relevance of the proposed work to veterinary dermatology, as described in the guidelines. The award will be granted and announced at the next AGM of the Society. Payment of the grant will be made into a special account and a budget report will be required by the ESVD Treasurer at the end of the study. Any funds not spent must be returned to the ESVD. Annual progress reports are required and should be submitted to the current Publications and Grant Secretary at least 30 days before the Society's AGM.



Successful applicants will be expected to submit their results for publication in Veterinary Dermatology and to present their findings to ESVD members at an ESVD Annual Congress within three years from receipt of the grant. The funds cannot be used for travel and accommodation at the meeting but only for research. However, the principal awardee is entitled to free registration at any ESVD Annual Congress at which he or she will present the data generated as a result of the grant.

Proposals should be prepared according to the following guidelines. As far as is practically possible, the proposals will be evaluated anonymously. Therefore, please include names, addresses and other identifying information only on the title page. Please make every effort to have no identifying information in the body of the proposal. Submitted along with the body of the proposal, as a separate document, should be one copy of the curriculum vitae of each of the principal investigators.

## Guidelines for Preparation of ESVD Grant Applications:

Applications not adhering to these guidelines may be excluded from consideration. The number of pages listed are maximum numbers. Shorter proposals are acceptable and welcomed.

## Section 1 (one page maximum)

Title page should include the project title, the name and title of the investigator, the institute at which the research will be performed, and the dates of the proposed project period.

### Section 2. (one page maximum)

- i) Provide a brief abstract with clearly stated objectives and the importance of the research, the experimental design and the methods used for achieving the stated objectives.
- Specific aim(s): State in general terms the long term objective(s) and the hypothesis to be tested.

## Section 3 (2 pages maximum)

Background and significance: In this section, briefly review the background for the present proposal, and the gaps in knowledge that the proposed project will fill.

#### Section 4 (2 pages maximum)

Preliminary studies: If there are preliminary data to support the hypothesis or to demonstrate that the investigator is familiar with the proposed methods, they should be included. If there are no preliminary results, then this section can be omitted.

## Section 5 (4 pages maximum)

- i) Experimental design and methods: This section should contain a concise discussion of the experimental design and the procedures to be used to accomplish the specific aims listed above. This section should be sufficiently detailed so that the feasibility may be judged. This section should list a brief description of resources available to investigators. It is important to discuss the means by which the data will be collected, analysed and interpreted, and the controls that will be required to allow a proper analysis. The type of statistical evaluation to be used for data analysis should be briefly detailed. Investigators should justify the sizes of experimental groups.
- ii) Animal use: Projects must fulfil the requirements of legislation in force in the country in which the work is to be performed. A statement to this effect should be included in the application. Any project proposal involving animals must be evaluated by the applicant's institution animal use committee and a statement to that effect should also be included in the proposal. If pets are to be used in the project, a permission form for the owners to complete should be appended to the proposal. Unless animal care and use has been carefully addressed, a proposal can not be considered for funding.

#### Section 6 (one page maximum)

A one page detailed budget should be included. The ESVD will not subsidise professional veterinary fees incurred by clients in the investigation of animals involved in clinical projects.

### Section 7 (one page maximum)

References should be provided for Section 3 (background information) and section 4 (methods).

## Minutes of the 19th AGM of the ESVD

Congress Center, Piramide de Arona, Playa Las Américas, Tenerife - September 5<sup>th</sup> 2003

Margreet Vroom, President of the ESVD opened the meeting.

## Treasurers Report (T Whitbread)

A general overview of the accounts was presented with no comments from the floor.

#### Membership Secretary Report (T Whitbread)

There were 10 applications for full membership and they were accepted on a vote. Details previously given in the Autumn bulletin.

T Whitbread informed the meeting that there were 490 members of ESVD with an additional 70 that had not renewed so far. A note was included in the Spring Bulletin in 2003 for non-renewing members asking why members had not renewed – no replies were received.

## Publications Report (C Noli)

Votes of thanks were made and applause given for the retiring editor of the journal Veterinary Dermatology Dr Ian Mason (Dr Joan Rest will be replacing him as Chief Editor); for Dr Tim Nuttall for the ESVD Bulletin; for Professor David Lloyd for supporting the website, and to Professor Thierry Olivry for providing the list of references for the annual report.

There had been a suggestion in the meeting of the editorial board of the journal Veterinary Dermatology during the congress to remove the non-English abstracts from the end of each article – this was mainly because there had been some delays in publishing articles due to late provision of some abstracts. From the floor Dr D. Carlotti reported that in one lecture hall (Continuing Education program) the audience of at least 50 persons would not support this change.

Future issues of the journal were to include one on therapeutics and another to include the 18<sup>th</sup> ESVD congress (Nice, 2002) abstracts.



## Research Committee Report and the Nomination of the ESVD Research Grant (C Noli)

The reviewers had unanimously agreed to award funding for the study: Immunopathogenesis of recurrent urticaria in horses by Dr Petra Roosje and colleagues. Applications are encouraged from members – very few applications are received each year.

Dr Ulli Renge Harms award

Professor David Lloyd gave a short eulogy about Dr Harms life and announced that the review panel had made the award to the value of 1000 Euros to Dr Geneviève Marignac. He thanked Virbac for their support of the award for the next five years. The ESVD board will provide free registration for the 20<sup>th</sup> Congress in Greece. Dr Marignac was very proud to receive the award especially as she has followed the alternative route for the ECVD diploma and met Dr Harms 11 years ago at the dermatology courses of the European School of Advanced Veterinary Studies.

## Further Education Committee's Report (Z. Alhaidari)

The workshops planned for Cremona (Therapeutics, Nov, 2003); Lyons (Skin Biology, Jan 2004); Dermatopathology (May 2005); Immunodermatology (Edinburgh; Nov/Dec 2005) canine dermatology (Germany; 2006) and endocrinology (Belgium; June 2006) were mentioned.

The next annual congress will be in Greece 6-8<sup>th</sup> September 2005. Dr Beco asked for future meetings to be later in the month to avoid clashing with the start of the schoolchildren autumn term.

## Any other business

- Details of the Charity Commission document that will enable the ESVD board to become the directors of a limited liability company with charitable status will be posted on the ESVD website for comment in due course.
- 2 ESVD board elections are due for 2004 and members will receive further details in the autumn bulletin.
- Structure of the annual congress: there was considerable debate about how to arrange future meetings e.g. would a continuing education component be required in all meetings? Could more time be devoted to free communications and sessions arranged so that more delegates could attend the latter and the scientific program? This would have to consider factors such as local interest from vets who may attend for the CE component. There could be two free communication concurrent sessions with one for clinical material and the other for research/scientific studies. State of the art lectures could replace CE programs where there was considerable CE already provided in the local area. It was concluded that the local organisers should consider carefully the impact of having no CE component and ESVD should ask the membership for a wider discussion of what should be the content of the annual congress.
- 4 Thanks were offered to Zeineb Alhaidari and Emmanuel Bensignor for organising a highly successful and profitable congress in Nice.

The meeting was closed after 60 minutes by Margreet Vroom who thanked all of the members for attending.

The amounts for the Luxembourg euro account and UK sterling account have been amalgamated in the above analysis at an exchange rate of £1.00 = 1.5 euro.



#### INCOME

The total income from the membership fee is going down and this is partly because the membership does appear to be decreasing each year, however, this decrease has recently slowed markedly. The other reason is the change in renewal date for membership. This used to be in the middle of the year until very recently, and now that we have changed this we have a situation where variable amounts of 2003 membership were actually paid in 2002. The change to January 1<sup>51</sup> renewal date has enabled us to instruct Blackwell to send Veterinary Dermatology Journal only to those that have renewed their membership, whereas this was not possible before when renewal was in the middle of the year. We, therefore, no longer pay for copies of Veterinary Dermatology sent to members who subsequently will not renew their membership.

#### Interest

Interest on both the UK and the Luxembourg Accounts again is modest because of low rates of interest for savers.

### Annual Congress

We must thank the organisers of the Nice Congress for the tremendous result in terms of income from the Congress. This is substantially due to very generous support by the sponsors and by commercial exhibitors.

#### Courses

Two of the workshops in 2003 each made a modest profit, again predominantly thanks to sponsors and exhibitors.

#### **EXPENSES**

There are some amounts in this figure for 2003 that was actually owed from 2002, and taking this into account expenses for board meetings are still on the decline. We have managed for the last two years to have only two instead of the more customary three board meetings. In 2003 we had one in Paris and one at the Annual Congress in Tenerife.

### Veterinary Dermatology

The cost of Veterinary Dermatology to the society has increased each year over the last two years, with the introduction of an extra two editions. We would anticipate this to increase further, as there has been a request to increase the size of Veterinary Dermatology to accommodate the articles that are being submitted. This will add to the printing costs which Blackwell will then pass on to the ESVD. This figure includes eight thousand one hundred and nine euros for catch-up on Veterinary Dermatology issues for members that joined late in the year of 2002.

## Bank Charges

These are very modest charges considering this includes the fee for our Visa payments.

#### Secretary and Mailing

Mailing costs are actually quite expensive and are getting more expensive, and there is a lot of secretarial input for the Visa payments, but we are managing to reduce this each year and we are now administering the society for less than ten euros per member.

#### ESVD Publications

This is an artificially low figure and I would estimate the figure to be on average similar to previous years, but there are a number of late invoices that will be included in the 2004 accounts.

#### Miscellaneous

Again this is principally for maintenance of our Website and membership of FECAVA.

#### ECVE

As you know, ESVD share profits of the Annual Congress with ECVD. This did not on this occasion go through the ESVD bank account but was automatically transferred to ECVD, and therefore does not appear in our accounts.



#### **ESVD Grant**

This was awarded for 2003 to Petra Roosje.

#### US Account

Again we maintained a small balance in this account for payment of expenses to speakers from the US.

#### **Dutch Account**

We are maintaining a small reserve in the Dutch Account which on 31/12/2003 totalled 1872.36 euros.

#### GENERAL COMMENTS

During the period of preparing these accounts the sterling/euro exchange rate has varied from 1.4 to 1.5 euros per pound and this has more volatility than we have seen for quite some time. I have decided to convert all sterling figures into euros at a rate of 1.5 euro = £1.00, which is the same as the figure used last year.

We currently have a situation where expenses of running the society now considerably exceeds income from membership fees. As you can see the expenses with the exception of the costs of Veterinary Dermatology have been steadily decreasing over the last five years, and there is still room for improvement here. For example in 2004 we conducted a board meeting by teleconference, at a cost of 381 euros and we may be able to replace some board meetings in the future using telephone conferencing. It is not possible, however, to replace all board meetings in this way. The area of expenses that has increased considerably this year is Veterinary Dermatology and this may well increase again in the future. We have discussed the possibility of increasing the fees for ESVD membership, but in view of the very healthy balance that we currently have thanks especially to the organisers of the Nice Congress, this has been deferred.
